**Church is Changing Week 2** (updates in **bold**)

As you may have heard, the Church of England, in response to the government's advice, has decided to suspend public worship. **This week church baptisms and weddings have also been suspended. Emergency baptisms are still permitted in the home, as are graveside funerals but only with immediate family.**

In response to this time of crisis we at St Mary's will be taking the following measures in line with our vision, Loving God - Loving Community:

**~ Worship Services**

We will broadcast a simple service from St Mary's Vicarage each Sunday morning by 10.30am latest. We use YouTube. **Last Sunday 170 people viewed the service.**

**~ Prayer**

**The church is now closed even for private prayer by order of the archbishop.** There will be resources on the website to help our devotional life. **Do look for the sheet on making a spiritual communion without the sacrament.** We do need to pray that people will follow the Chief Medical Officer's advice and that the virus, by God's grace, is suppressed.

**~ Volunteering**

We are enabling volunteers to link up with the housebound. We would encourage you to help your immediate neighbours without referring to the church. But if there is no one to help you, or you have time to run errands for others, then please contact

the Church Office which will be operating as the hub. The telephone will be monitored daily (01243 552792.) This service will be open to all villagers both as volunteers and recipients.

Volunteers should expect to fill out a simple self-declaration form and be registered by the Parochial Church Council in order to prevent fraud. Volunteers should expect to buy goods out of their own pockets and then be reimbursed by cash or cheque on delivery of the goods with a receipt. A log of all contacts will be kept. Entering houses will not be part of this role as that would require a DBS check.

### **~ Financial Help**

For those facing financial hardship we will be using The Walberton, Binsted and West Barnham Sick Poor Fund (Reg Charity 243280). Many of us have plenty of reserves but some do not. The Sick Poor Fund is the parish charity run by the vicar, churchwardens and up to three trustees. It has an income of about £8,000 per year. We currently have about £9,000 in reserve. We can make emergency grants of up to £200 as well as other more regular grants. We usually do so through food vouchers or paying heating bills. A few years ago we changed the qualification for help from being 'sick and poor' to 'sick or poor'. The area of benefit is Walberton, Binsted and West Barnham (up to the railway bridge). People need to live, work or attend educational establishments or community organisations or churches in the area of benefit.

If you know of anyone who is financially struggling - especially anyone who is under the Statutory Sick Pay threshold for earnings of £118 per week - and has lost their income, then, please, do let me know by phone or letter, preferably asking them first (01243 551488). Down the road we will need the wealthy in this community to bless those falling into dire straits through no fault of their own. If you would be willing to contribute, come the time, then, please send me an email and I will send you the charity's bank details when the need arises.
